RATIONAL & RELATIONAL FAITH SYLLABUS

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course equips students to give rational explanations for Christianity as well as to present Christian truth on a personal and relational level to non-Christians and those struggling to keep their faith. We will consider concrete ways to implement and integrate apologetics personally, occupationally, in the local church, and the world at large.

COURSE OBJECTIVES: To equip students to understand the times and develop an apologetic method and competence to address the issues that keep people from the Gospel. To critically evaluate systems of thought that compete for the minds of men and women and consider solutions to the major problems that confront the biblical position today in a postmodern world. Positively, to build a cumulative case argument for Christian theism so that believers may know and show their faith better. Students will learn both the arguments for Christianity and how to relationally engage unbelievers with Christian truth. Relational engagement requires skills in loving, praying, listening, the creative initiation of apologetic discussions, and more.
