







14 "I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God. For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."








Jesus rebukes those who trust in themselves.

9 To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everyone else Jesus told this parable (NIV)






