What is mercy?

mercy: compassion or forgiveness shown toward someone whom it is within one's power to punish or harm.



Grace vs. Mercy

Grace is getting what you don't deserve. Mercy is not getting what you do deserve.



Mercy in the Bible

- 1. Greek: "Eleos": compassion, kindness
- 2. Hebrew: "Hesed": covenant love
- 3. Hebrew: "Racham": compassionate love



Psalm 51:1-2

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love (hesed); according to your great compassion (racham), blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.

Exodus 34:6

Psalm 145:8-9

The The LORD is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. The LORD is good to all, and his mercy is over all that he has made.



Lamentations 3:22-23

The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; **His mercies never end**; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.
